KEY LARGO KAYAKING ADVENTURE

Begin your journey across the bay into the mangroves. Stop along the way for the comparative study of the mangrove ecosystem. Discussions will include the biological importance of mangroves, detritus food chains, and the diversity of organisms that depend on mangrove communities for their continued survival. Arrive at Robbie's Marina to feed the giant Tarpon that peacefully swims around the docks. Once the fish are fed, spend some time souvenir shopping,



BONE VALLEY

Travel northwest to Canoe Outpost Peace River. Understand the geologic timeline of Florida that led to the creation of a thick, fossil-rich layer under the state known as the "Bone Valley" formation. Florida used to be a shallow coral reef, which has led to the creation of numerous marine fossils in the center of the state. Learn how fossils are formed. Begin your canoeing adventure on the Peace River, hunting for fossils in sandbars using shovels and screens. Shark teeth, sting ray mandibles, dugong ribs, three-toed horse teeth, camel teeth, mastodon molars, and the occasional Native American arrowhead are just some of the treasures to be found. Each student will be able to keep the fossils found during this exciting adventure! The experience is a re-enactment of the adventures of Captain Lebaron when he discovered fossils and phosphate around the area known as "Bone Valley" in 1881.
